# **School Attendance**

Attendance in school has been particularly low this half term. Although we understand that many children have been ill with seasonal bugs, holidays taken in term time are causing a significant amount of absence.

The Department of Education are placing high priority on attendance and schools are instructed to share their attendance figures daily.

We are extremely proud of our school, the children and the outcomes we achieve, but currently we are one of the lowest performing schools in the local area for attendance, with it being just 93% and our target is 96%.

Our attendance is usually much higher than this, therefore this causes us a great deal of concern as many children are losing vital learning and in some cases, find it difficult to catch up.

We kindly ask for you to support us in trying to ensure your child attends school each day in order for them to reach their full learning potential.

# <u>Class Dojo</u>

Almost all parents have now downloaded the app for Class Dojo – thank you.

We do hope you are finding this to be a more effective way of receiving messages from us.

If you have any feedback regarding Class Dojo that you would like to share, we would welcome it as we are striving to ensure our lines of communication with you all are as successful and straightforward as possible.

## Parent Consultations

Parent consultations will take place on Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> November from 9am.

Appointments can currently be booked using the School Spider app however, for our next consultation day in the spring term, we will move to Class Dojo to make the appointments.

We found, last year, that you appreciated us giving you the option of either having a face to face or telephone consultation with your child's class teacher so we are continuing with this.

We hope, that by starting the consultations at 9am, and offering the two above options, that this makes it easier for parents who might otherwise struggle to be able to speak to the teacher.

Also, by using the whole day we are expecting the hall to be less busy which will hopefully allow you to have more opportunity to discuss how your child has settled in to this new school year, and to ask any questions you might have.

Please note that our staff are available to speak with you before and after school throughout the school year, not just on parent consultation days so if you have anything you are concerned about or would like to ask, please contact our office, and we will arrange a call back or meeting.

## **Remembrance Sunday**



On Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> November at 9.30am at St Luke's in Grimethorpe, we will be remembering those who have lost their lives due to conflict.
