### Assessments

Year 6 will be sitting SATS from Monday 12<sup>th</sup> May until Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> May.

We will be offering breakfast in class from 8am to these children so they are as prepared and relaxed as possible, ready for the tests.

Year 4 will be taking their times table test over the week beginning 2nd June

Year 1 and some children in Year 2 will be having their phonics screening check. This will take place during the week beginning 9<sup>th</sup> June.

Also throughout May, our Year 2 children will be undertaking their optional SATs.

As you can see it is a very busy time for assessments and any help at home you can give to your children will really help them prepare. If you need support for how to help your children at home, please speak to your child's class teacher.

# <u>Attendance</u>

A huge thank you to all who have supported us with our drive to improve attendance at school. We can see results already – you have made a fantastic effort.

We have listened to feedback from parents about our attendance drive.

Of course, some children come to school and meet the target of 96% attendance, but there will always be some who, unfortunately do not manage to reach this. Whilst we will endeavour to be as fair as possible, our intention is to offer an incentive to encourage as many children as possible to meet this target.

Holidays taken in term time have a huge impact on a child's attendance percentage.

We currently offer a variety of rewards aimed at encouraging children to attend.

Each half term, the class with the most attendance wins a party. This half term, the wining class Year 4 Class White. Every child in class has enjoyed a disco and party food as a celebration.

In addition, when children come to school for a full week and are on time, their name goes into our Friday prize draw and they have the chance of winning a prize.

An end of term reward is offered in the form of an outing. This is already planned for the end of the Summer term and will be for those children who meet our target of 96% as well as any children who have vastly improved their attendance across the whole year.
